APPROVAL OF APPLICATION A-19259  
WATER DIVISION 1-D

BACKGROUND

1. On May 28, 2014, Alfred Daubendiek, Jr., filed in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) application A-19259 for a Permit to appropriate water.
2. On August 5, 2014, Alfred Daubendiek, Jr., filed in the Department map number 19011 showing land proposed to be irrigated under application A-19259.
3. Construction has been completed.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that application A-19259 is APPROVED subject to the following limitations and conditions:

1. The source of water is a tributary to Mud Creek.
2. The water shall be used for the purpose of irrigation.
3. The priority date is May 28, 2014.
4. Only the land shown on map number 19011 may be irrigated under appropriation A-19259.
5. Water diverted under appropriation A-19259 shall not exceed the ratio of one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated. Total annual volume of water diverted may not exceed 3 acre-feet per acre irrigated and the least amount that can be beneficially used.
6. A measuring device, approved by the Department, is **required** to be installed at both pumpsites on the tributary to Mud Creek as depicted on map number 19011 to meter the amount of water diverted from the stream under natural flow appropriation A-19259 into Daubendiek Reservoir Number 3.
7. A measuring device, approved by the Department, is **required** to be installed to meter the amount of water withdrawn from Daubendiek Reservoir Number 3 under natural flow appropriation A-19259 for the purpose of irrigation.

8. Additional measuring, instrumentation or reporting requirements may be required as needed for the Department to efficiently administer water use in Water Division 1-D.
9. Approval of A-19259 is based on the information included in application A-19259 and representations made on map number 19011 signed by Alfred Daubendiek, Jr., on January 5, 2015. That information and those representations are considered terms of this approval, to which the permit holder must adhere.
10. This appropriation is subject to the provisions of the Blue River Compact and could be closed if Compact flows are not being met.
11. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. The statutes include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
  - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
  - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.
12. The appropriator must comply with the following deadlines:
  - A. The appropriation is not considered perfected until water has been beneficially applied for the purpose stated in this approval. The water appropriated under A-19259 must be beneficially used by September 1, 2017.
  - B. After September 1, 2017, a field investigation will be conducted to determine the acres irrigated, after which an order of cancellation will be issued for any unused portions of appropriation A-19259.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may result in the cancellation of the appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use a portion or all of a perfected appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations. If in the future you are not able to divert sufficient amounts of water, and if there are junior appropriations upstream, you may call for water by contacting your local field office.

Box 94676, Lincoln, Nebraska 68509-4676) within 30 days of the date of the order and be accompanied by a filing fee of \$10.
