APPROVAL OF EXPEDITED TRANSFER EXT-1825 FOR WATER APPROPRIATION A-8839

WATER DIVISION 1-D

Background

1. Records on file in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) show that surface water appropriation A-8839 is held by Donald L. and Patricia J. Jirsa.
2. Appropriation A-8839 has a priority date of September 18, 1956, and authorizes the use of water for irrigation of the 79.0 acres of land described below. The water may be diverted from the Big Blue River at points of diversion located on the right bank of the stream in the S $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the E $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, Township 9 North, Range 4 East of the 6th P.M. in Seward County. The rate that water may be diverted shall not exceed one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum combined rate of 1.13 cfs (507 gallons per minute) from all points of diversion.

3. On December 1, 2009, Donald L. and Patricia J. Jirsa filed application EXT-1825 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use for land authorized to be irrigated by appropriation A-8839.
4. On January 13, 2010, Donald L. and Patricia J. Jirsa filed map number 17555 showing the land proposed to be irrigated under appropriation A-8839 through transfer EXT-1825.

Order

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Application EXT-1825 for a permit for an expedited transfer of the location of use and map number 17555 are APPROVED.

2. Appropriation A-8839 through transfer EXT-1825 authorizes the use of water to irrigate 79.0 acres of land described below and depicted on map number 17555, which is made a part of this Order. The water may be diverted from the Big Blue River at points of diversion located on the right bank of the stream in the S $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the E $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, Township 9 North, Range 4 East of the 6th P.M. in Seward County. The rate that water may be diverted shall not exceed one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum combined rate of 1.13 cfs (507 gallons per minute) from all points of diversion. The total volume may not exceed 3 acre-feet per irrigated acre per year.

3. All terms and conditions of appropriation A-8839 remain in effect unless specifically changed by this Order.
4. A measuring device approved by the Department is required.
5. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. This includes, but is not limited to, the following:
- A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
 - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
 - C. Obtain approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

Additional Information

Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may cause cancellation of part or all of this appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use an appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations.
