APPROVAL OF APPLICATION A-18787

WATER DIVISION 1-D

BACKGROUND

1. On May 31, 2011, Harold Stokebrand filed in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) application A-18787 for a Permit to Appropriate Water.
2. On June 8, 2011, Harold Stokebrand filed map number 17874 showing land proposed to be irrigated under application A-18787.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that application A-18787 is APPROVED subject to the following limitations and conditions:

1. The source of water is Turkey Creek.
2. The water shall be used for the purpose of irrigation.
3. The priority date is May 31, 2011.
4. Only the land shown on map number 17874 may be irrigated under appropriation A-18787.
5. The rate that water may be diverted under appropriation A-18787 shall not exceed one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated.
6. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. The statutes include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - A. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
  - B. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
  - C. Obtaining approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

DEADLINES

1. The appropriation is not considered perfected until water has been beneficially applied for the purpose stated in this approval. The water appropriated under A-18787 must be beneficially used by September 1, 2013.
2. After September 1, 2013, a field investigation will be conducted to determine the amount of water used and acres irrigated, after which an order of cancellation will be issued for any unused portions of appropriation A-18787.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION


Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may result in the cancellation of the appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use a portion or all of a perfected appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

If in the future you are not able to divert sufficient amounts of water, and if there are junior appropriations upstream, you may call for water by contacting your local field office.

The applicant and any person with sufficient legal interest who has been or may be substantially affected by this order may request a contested case hearing in accordance with the *Neb. Admin. Procedures Act* §§ 84-901 et. seq. RRS and the Department's *Rules of Practice and Procedure 454 Neb. Admin. Code Chapter 7*. The request must be received by the Department at its Lincoln office (4<sup>th</sup> Floor, Nebraska State Office Building, 301 Centennial Mall South, P.O. Box 94676, Lincoln, Nebraska 68509-4676) within 30 days of the date of the order and be accompanied by a filing fee of \$10.
